RULES

AND

REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED BY

Innkeepers

In the Eastern District

oF

UPPER CANADA.

1st. Every Person keeping an Inn, within the Eastern District, must have a comfortable Sitting Room and Bed Room, and at least two good clean Beds, for the use of Travellers, and to be ready at the shortest notice, to furnish a good and substantial Breakfast, Dinner or Supper.

2d. Every Innkeeper must have Stable room for three pairs of Horses, to be warm and comfortable, with plenty of Hay and Oats, and must either by himself or his Servant, attend to the feeding and care of the Horses of Travellers and others resorting to their Houses, on being required so to do. And it shall be incumbent on all Innkeepers, to have a good Shed in a convenient place, for the accommodation of Travellers, with a Manger thereto, and a good and spacious Yard, well fenced, and with a good and sufficient Gate, to guard the Sleighs and Baggage of Travellers and others from being injured by Cattle or Hogs.

3d No Innkeeper shall sell Wine, Brandy, or other Spirituous Liquors, on Sunday, except to Travellers, whose place of residence is five miles or more distant from the Inn where the same may be called for or required; nor shall any Innkeeper suffer any Gaming or Gambling to be carried on in their Houses, at any time or by any Person whatever, except Billiards, where a Licence has or may be taken out for that purpose,

4th. It shall be the Duty of all Innkeepers to attend particularly to the comfort of Travellers, and to afford them every convenience which their situation and circumstances will admit.
