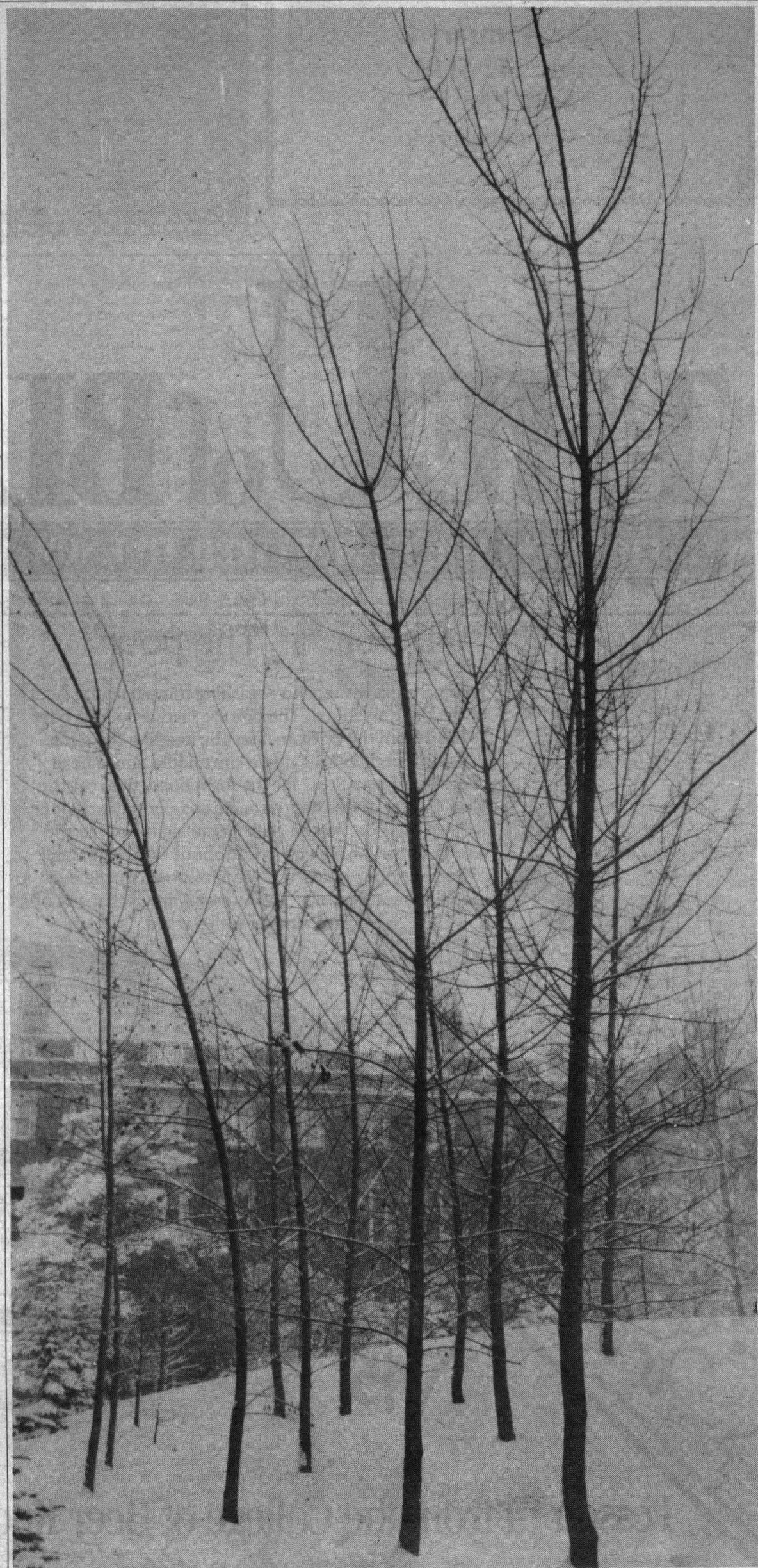
Isn't everyone excited about returning to school? Take heart, only 48 days until reading week.
