



1 asked Q. Well, the question there I am asking you
2 about is near the end there; after he had apparently
3 given you his full narrative, then you started to ask
4 some questions? A. I asked the question, "How many
5 times did you hit Isaac Hill with the gun?" and that
6 is asked because earlier in the statement proper he
7 had said, "At that remark, I got mad, and I hit him
8 with my shot gun." Now, I asked the question, "How
9 many times did you hit him with the shotgun?" because
10 in the body of the statement he had merely remarked,
11 "I got mad, and I hit him with the shot gun." He did
12 not say whether he hit him once, twice or a dozen
13 times. You say you were not looking to a cross-

14 exam Q. Well, some of the other statements show how
15 many times he hit him? A. I was not dealing with
16 the other statements. Knowledge did anyone else hit
17 Isaac Hill? But you had that information? A. I did not
18 have it with me. he shot gun?

19 HIS LORDSHIP: Q. But you had it all down in a
20 black and white in two or three statements, that he
21 had hit him once or twice or something like that with
22 the shotgun, hadn't you? A. Yes, that is true, your
23 lordship. Isaac Hill.

24 MR. LICKERS: Q. Were these questions asked after
25 that in connection with testing his credibility as to
26 the contents of not only this statement or the other
27 statements? A. They certainly were not, no.

28 HIS LORDSHIP: Q. It was not a cross-examination?
29 A. No, it was not, your lordship, not by any
30 means. I feel and felt then that any questions that I
