I am writing on behalf of the Memorial Committee of the Canadian Nurses Association to ask the Rt. Hon. Arthur Meighen, Prime Minister, to take part in the unveiling ceremony of the Memorial to the Canadian Nursing Sisters, which is being unveiled on the afternoon of August, 24th. at 3.30,

I am sure that the Prime Minister knows of the erection of the Memorial, but as he has not been closely in touch with the work as it has developed. I would like to give some information of the Memorial as planned. The funds for the erection of the Memorial were contributed by the nurses of Canada and permission was given by the Federal Government to place the Memorial in the corridor of the Parliament Buildings directly outside the entrance to the Library. At the unveiling ceremony The Canadian Nurses Association would appreciate it very much if the Prime Minister would consent to receive the Memorial on behalf of the people of Canada.

We can quite understand that the Prime Minister will have his time very fully occupied, but we sincerely hope that he may be able to grant our request. I would be very grateful if you would forward this letter to the Prime Minister and ask that the reply as to his decision be sent to me by wire as the official programme of the unveiling ceremony has to be sent to the press in the near future.
