would have stated that during the electoral compaign of 1980 he was acting as trustee for the funds of the Liberal Party and in that quality only had received from Mr. Sweezey, of his own motion, the sum which Sweezey subsequently mentioned in his statement to the Commons Committee; that in due course he turned all' of this money over to the treasurer of this party; that he subsequently received a telegram from the Committee asking his presence in Ottawa; that he was informed by Mr. MacKenzie, who said he had conferred with the Chairman, Mr. Gordon, that Senator Raymond would not further be required; that he again informed Hr. MacKensie that he would be subject to the call of the Committee at any time and could be in Ottawa at three hours' notice. (Pages A83-84-86)

It is not deemed necessary here to set out the early history of Senater Raymond's connection with the Beauharmois project, as that is very clearly done at Roman numeral page BB6 hereing before referred to.

Senator Raymond was examined by Mr. Smith, pages AlS1-140 inclusive, and recalled at page Al49.

There is no doubt that Senator Raymond knew that the grant to the Beauharnois Company from the Province of Quebes was valueless without the approval of the Dominion Government. (AlSE)
