On February 26th he was taken on board ship and given treatment in the sick bay. Throughout the passage the medical officer refused to give him any kind of drug, but he obtained two small packets each containing 2 grammes of quinine from a sick-berth attendant. He took one gramme and the fever went down. At Naples, B. and M. were confined in the prison with criminals - drinkers. They left Naples for Rome the same evening.

In Rome Dr. B. was given some treatment for the first time. He was taken to the hotel with M, where they were given food and drink, etc. There they saw the Polish Ambassador in Rome, who gave them money, but only for their journey as far as Berne. Dr. B., who on his arrival in Rome was wearing his field uniform with solar helmet, was given clothes by a journalist.

In Rome the Chief of Police made Dr. B. sign a statement in which he undertook not to return to Ethiopia. Dr. B. was prepared by that time to sign any statement which would enable him to leave Italy.

Dr. B.left all his possessions behind in Ethiopia. He is the owner of a house, a plantation,  $\epsilon$  to, and had been settled in Addis Ababa for a year past.

Dr. B. wishes a copy of his deposition to be sent to Addis Ababa. He also wishes a telegram to be sent to Mr. Buxton in Addis Ababa to ask the latter to send him money. His personal possessions were reposited with Mr. Buxton.
