(3) I have to request that you will
explain why in the former case
you neglected your instructions,
and in the latter exceeded them.

(4) I have to request that you will
be good enough to transmit with
the least possible delay the de-
tailed accounts of the merchants
(acknowledged by the Indians)
from which you prepared your
Statement of the Indian indebted-

ness (5) You will also remit
at once to the Department the
unexpended balance of the
collections now in your hands.

(6) In future you will refund
to the Department all further
