Ottawa , and May, 1907.

Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 30th tiltime, I beg to say that the Department approves of your incurring an expenditure of forty dollars in affecting the purchase of seed for your Indians.

You should not give out any seed until each applicant therefor has prepared his land for seeding; and you should only give seed to those Indians who are likely to make good use of the same.

If posible you should have the Indians provide in the fall out of their respective crops for their requirements next spring.
