Sir:-

I return herewith the account that you submitted from Mr. C.A. Sullivan for supplies furnished to Indians. Before the request for payment can be considered, it will be necessary for it to be amended so as to show the quantity of each article supplied. The Department will not allow the purchase of patent cigarettes at a \$1.00 a bottle, for Indians. If the Indians want cigarettes, they should apply to the medical officer for such supplies as they require.

In future the only supplies to be issued in the way of relief are provisions which should consist of necessaries, and which, in any way, should not be given out unless authority for the expenditure has been received from out-quarters. If clothing or supplies are applied for, you should make a special report to the Department in regard to each application.
