Rev. Sir,-

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 22nd ultimo enclosing applications for the admission of six children to the Brandon Industrial School.

In reply I beg to say that the applications for the admission of the Fisher children are not satisfactory as they stand and Mr. Inspector Wynn is being asked for information.

The admission of Arthur S. Moore, a half-breed, cannot be approved. As you are aware, it is contrary to the policy of the Department to admit half-breeds.

The application for the admission of Sarah Lolate, who is said to be paid under Lake St. Martin Band No. 26, is not signed as you remark. An examination of the pay list does not show any girl paid under No. 26 of this band and some explanation is necessary here as to why the application is not signed ^{as to} and the band number under which the girl is paid.

In future the Department must see that all applications for admission to the Brandon Industrial School be approved of by the Indian Agent of the band from which the children are drafted. This will avoid confusion and be more satisfactory to all concerned.
