A-23 Yes, sir.

Q-24 That is, but E. 23 E?

A-24 Yes, sir.

Q-25 What time did you go to bed?

A-25 About twelve o'clock, sir.

Q-26 What did you do with your money when you went to bed?

A-26 It was in this pocket in my battle dress. (Indicating large pocket in leg of trousers.) I put my trousers on the bed above me.....

Q-27 The money was there?

A-27 Yes, sir, the money was in my bill-fold and the bill-fold was in the trousers, and my cigarette lighter, I am not sure whether I put it under my pillow or at the head of my bed, but when I woke up in the morning the lighter wasn't there and I immediately looked to see if it was in my clothes and when I saw it wasn't I looked in my bill-fold and there was only twenty cents left.

Q-28 The bills were gone?

A-28 Yes, sir.

Q-29 Did anybody occupy the bed above you that night?

A-29 No. sir.

Q-30 Did you give anyone permission to take either the money or the lighter?

A-30 No, sir.

CROSS-EXAMINED BY THE DEFENDING OFFICER:

Q-31 McLennan, did you see Trooper Adams in the wet canteen?

A-31 Yes, sir.

Q-32 Were you talking to him?

A-32 Yes, sir, we were talking.

Q-33 He was drinking?

A-33 I believe so, sir. We were all drinking that night.

Q-34 Were you on the same party with him?

A-34 We were all sitting at the same table, sir.
