

COOK'S FERRY RESERVES.

QUILTANTON NO. 13. COOK'S FERRY.

This reserve is also situated in the Highland Valley. It contains 520 acres. It was visited June 4th, 1914. There are about 150 acres of bottom land, a portion of which is covered with brush, the balance being swamp meadow hay. Owing to the poor quality of the hay for winter feeding, we valued this plot at \$20.00 per acre..... 3,000.00  
 Fully 75 acres of this reserve is taken up by the two lakes at each end, the remaining 295 acres is sandy and gravel covered with scrub jack pine, poor pasture. Valued at \$2.50 per acre..... 737.50  
 Total value of the whole reserve..... 3,737.00  
 Average for the whole reserve \$7.18 1/2 per acre; average for available land \$8.40 per acre.

ENQUOCTO NO. 14 COOK'S FERRY.

Also situated in the Highland valley and contains 560 acres. It was visited June 4th. There are about 160 acres of bottom meadow land a little over half in swamp hay of a little better quality. The other portions brush valued at \$25.00 per acre..... 4,000.00  
 The remaining 400 acres poor sandy and gravelly land covered with scrub jack pine valued at \$2.50 per acre..... 1,000.00  
 Total value..... 5,000.00  
 Average of \$8.93 per acre.

SEUL-TAN-KIL-HATS. NO. 15 COOK'S FERRY.

Contains 520 acres. Also in the Highland Valley. It was visited June 4th. There are about 220 acres of bottom meadow land; about 100 acres of which is open hay meadow; the balance underbrush. Here a faint attempt is made to cultivate about half an acre of ground, as a garden patch, which does not affect our valuation of \$25.00 per acre..... 5,500.00  
 300 acres are of the same character of soil but slightly better pasture, being more open, which we place at \$3.00 per acre..... 900.00  
 Total value..... 6,400.00  
 Average \$12.30 per acre.
