

26. On the call of seven members, a majority of the Lodge may demand the previous question, which shall always be put in this form: "Shall the main question now be put?" and until it is decided, shall preclude all amendments and all further debate.

27. When the reading of any paper or other matter is called for and the same is objected to by any member, it shall be determined by a vote of the Lodge, without debate.

28. When a question is postponed indefinitely, it shall not be acted upon during that or the next succeeding stated convention.

29. After any question, except one of indefinite postponement, has been decided, any member who voted in the majority may at the same or next regular convention move for reconsideration thereof, but no discussion of the main question shall be allowed unless reconsidered, but a motion to reconsider cannot be entertained.

30. No resolution shall be offered to the Lodge except in writing and signed by the members offering the same.

31. No part of these Rules of Order shall be repealed or amended, unless a proposition in writing, stating the change, shall be made at one regular convention previous to the time of its being acted upon and adopted by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, but any one of them, or any part thereof, may be suspended for the time being by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

NOTE.—All rules of order not herein contained shall be decided by Cushing's Manual of Parliamentary Rules.
