

and that they have, moreover, successfully passed the primary examination, before the assessors of the Board.

Any candidate undergoing his final examination on all or part of the subjects, and failing on one subject, shall have to pass another examination on the same, which examination shall only take place three months later.

20. The assessors shall decide whether the students possess a sufficient knowledge of the subjects upon which they are examined. If the assessors, in opposition to the University Examiners, are not satisfied with the answers of a candidate, they shall request the Examiners to prolong the examination of such candidate, or, if necessary, ask leave to put a few questions, themselves.

30. The assessors shall ascertain that the courses given by the Universities, Colleges or Schools of Medicine, are in accordance with the requirements of the law, both as regards their duration and the number of lectures given, etc., etc.

40. They shall ascertain that the students have followed the courses as required by law.

50. They shall examine the certificates of admission to the study of Medicine and the cards of attendance at lectures, at Hospital practice and at cases of confinement.

60. They shall draft a report in the form of schedule B annexed to the present By-Laws and corresponding to the above mentioned directions.

IV. In case the report of the assessors shall prove unfavorable to any University, College or School of Medicine, the Board shall authorize its President to no-
