This Association was organized 28th August, 1877, its object being to afford immediate relief to the families of deceased ministers, members of the Association.

It is a kind of Mutual Life Insurance Company, and each member, on being notified of the death of a fellow member, agrees to pay an assessment which is graduated according to the ages of the members, and according to the following scale:—Under 30 years of age members pay \$2.50; between 30 and 35, \$3.00; 35 to 40, \$3.50; 40 to 45, \$4.00; 45 to 50, \$4.50; 50 and upwards, \$5.00.

Honorary members pay \$1.00 each assessment on notice of the death of a ministerial member of the Association.
