EXECUTIVE REPORT.

The Executive Board of the Philatelic Society of Canada, after careful consideration, deem it wise to establish a *duplex* system of exchange, in order to suit the younger and less advanced collectors, who we look upon as the life of our Society. This addition to our already fine exchange system will not affect that already established, which ensures safety to all participating, and guarantees to the advanced collector the surest and best method of disposing of his duplicates. The "duplex" system will give another exchange, in which the beginners and junior collectors can participate without being put to the guarantees required in the present system now in vogue.

Your Executive have also had laid before them an invitation from the two Ottawa branches of the Society, inviting the Convention to the Capital for their first meeting. We therefore appoint Ottawa as the place of our first Convention, and the date will be left open, but will be placed by the President to immediately follow the A. P. A. Convention in August next.
