PLANTING, CULTIVATING AND HARVESTING THE POTATO. A Mr. May made a series of careful experiments in planting potatoes, the results of which he sums up as follows: 1. Every increase in the size of the set, from one ounce up to eight ounces in weight, produces an increase in the crop much greater than the additional weight of the set planted. The net profit, over and above the extra weight of the sets, in planting four-ounce sets over one-ounce sets, amounted on the whole series of experiments, to between three and four tons per acre; and the further profit on the increase of the size of the set from four ounces to eight ounces, averaged about five tons per acre, all the intermediate steps partaking proportionately of the increase.
