Accordingly the House resolved itself into the said Committee.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. Frobisher took the Chair of the Committee;

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair,

And Mr. Frobisher reported, that the Committee had made some progress and had directed him to move for leave to sit again.

Ordered, That the Committee have leave to fit again.

RESOLVED, That this House will, to-morrow, resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House, upon the said Bill:

And then, upon motion of Mr. Frobisher, seconded by Mr. Planté, The House Adjourned.
