

And then the Messenger withdrew.

Ordered, That Mr. Lawton, Mr. Albrow and Mr. Chipman, do manage the Conference with the Council, on the General State of the Province, and that the subject of the said Conference be confined solely to the Province Notes now in circulation.

And they went to the Conference.

And being returned,

Mr. Lawton reported that the Managers had been at the Conference, and stated the substance of the Conference to the House; and thereupon,

On motion, *resolved*, That a further Conference be desired with the Council, on the subject matter of the last Conference, and that the Clerk do request the same.

Ordered, That Mr. J. R. Dewolf and Mr. B. Dewolf, be added to the Managers for holding a further Conference with the Council.

The Clerk reported that the Council had agreed to a further Conference, as desired by the House.

Ordered, That the Managers who managed the last Conference do manage this Conference.

And they went to the Conference,

And being returned,

Mr. Lawton reported that the Managers had been at the Conference, and stated that the joint Committee of this House and His Majesty's Council, would shortly make a Report to His Majesty's Council and this House on the subject to them referred.

A Petition of Abraham Whitman, and others, Freeholders and Inhabitants of the County of Sydney; and also, a Petition of John Stewart, and others, Freeholders of the said County, were presented by Mr. Church, and read, severally complaining of the undue Election and Return of John Young, Esq. as a Representative for the said County of Sydney.

Ordered, That the Petitions do lie on the Table.

Then the House adjourned until To-morrow, at Twelve of the Clock.
