Majesty's Quit Rents, and applied to the use of the Colonv, together with a further sum, being part of the Quit Rent fund, as appears by a Minute of the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury bearing date the seventh day of August one Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy Six, a copy of which is hereunto annexed.

"And no part of the said sum except about one hundred and fifty pounds, having been yet paid or expended for the use of the Colony; the House of Assembly humbly requests that your Excellency may be pleased to make application for the same, either to his Maje ity's Ministers, or the Parliament of the United Kingdom, as in your Excellency's wisdom shall seem meet.

## Extract of the Minutes of the Treasury, 7th August, 1776.

" My Lords are of opioion, that the arrears of the Quit Reuts now due, and the " growing Quit Rent until the 1st of May, 1799, to which time, his Majesty has re-" linguished the same, for the benefit of the Island, should be applied, in the first " place to the payment of arrears of Salaries, due to the officers on the civil estab-"lishment of that Island, up to the first day of January next, and if after discharg-"ing and latisfying the arrears of Salaries, to the first day of January, 1777, there " fhall remain any furplus, their Lordships order, that the same be applied to the " making of Roads, and other Public Works, within the Illand. And my Lords " direct the former, as well as the prefent Receiver General of the Island, to apply " all fuch fums of money, as shall be in their hands to the above purputes and to " take all proper means to enforce payment of the arrears and the acruing Quit "Rents, and recover the fame. And my Lords, direct, that fuch of the Civil Of-" ficers, as shall have received any money out of the Sum of Three Thousand Pounds, " granted by Parliament, for the benefit of the Ifland, after receipt of their arrears, " do refund the Sums, they shall have fo received, in order that the whole of that " fum, may be applied, to the purposes for which the same was granted."

On Motion of Mr. Solicitor General, feconded by Dr. M'Aulay, the Houfe came to the following Refolution.

Resolved, that it be an inftruction from this Houfe to the Committee of Corref. pondence, to transmit to the Colony Agent, a copy of an Address, this day ordered to be prefented to His Excellency, relative to a Parliamentary Grant, and fundry arrears of Quit Rents, which were to be expended in this Island under the order of His Msjesty's Government; together with such information, on the subject, as the faid Committee can obtain, and most earnessly to request the folicitation and assistance of the Colony Agent, towards effecting the object, in faid Petition contained.

On Motion, of Mr. Solicitor Genreal, feconded by Dr. M<sup>c</sup>Aulay, that a Committee be appointed to draw, during the recefs, a Bill for the purpofe of raifing an Affeilment upon Land and Houfes, and a bounty upon grain and produce and that fuch Committee be required to correspond, if they shall think proper, from time to time, with the country Members, for the purpofe of procuring their fentiments on the fuoject, priviously communicating to them, the heads of fuch Bill, and the Bill shall be prefented to the Houfe, the first day after the recess or prorogation, the fame was canted nem. con. and Mr. Solicitor General, Dr. M<sup>c</sup>Aulay, Mr. Nelson, Mr. Dockendorff, and Mr. Hyde, were accordingly appointed.

Ordered, On Motion, of Mr. Solicitor, feconded by Mr. Nelson, that Lemuel Cambridge, Chartes Worrel, George Birnie, Fade Goff, and Charles Stewart, Elquires, having ablinted themfelves from their daty, and failed to attend as Members of
