Molyneux Found Not Guilty by Albert County Jury—Justice White Pre- sented With An Address

ROXBWELL CAPE, via Hillsboro, N.B., Jan. 18.—The January session of the Albert County Circuit Court opened here at 2 p.m. to-day, his Honor, Judge White presiding. Two criminal cases of considerable importance came before the court, that of the King vs. Thomas Molyneux charged with assault and doing grievous bodily harm to David L. Crossman and the King vs. Curry Bishop, Stanley Bishop, and Emerson Magee, three young boys who are charged with burning the school house at West River, Albert Co. There is no civil docket. The members of the bar in attendance are M. B. Dixon, clerk of the Court, Hon. J. D. Hazen, Attorney General, Geo. W. Fowler of Sussex, and A. W. Bray, clerk of the peace. Fred Devine was present as court reporter.

MID-WINTER MEETING OF MUNICIPAL COUNCIL

Estimates \$600 Greater Than Last Year's—Coun. Lewis is a Philosopher

Dr. Curran Gets Vacancy on Hospital Board

The Municipal Council at the regular January meeting yesterday afternoon passed the estimates for the ensuing year and raised the salaries of several county officials. The salary of the two policemen who have charge of the chain-gang was increased to \$2 per day, and that of the two turnkeys was in- creased to \$6 per month. Councilor Cur- ran was appointed to the position of the Board of Commissioners for the General Public Hospital made vacant by the death of Dr. A. W. MacRae. The estimates for the ensuing year in- creased by \$500 per year. The majority of the county members favored the in- crease. The city members opposed it. The Council adjourned without estab- lishing a joint committee to consider the principal points in the provin- cial highway board.
