Meeting of the Board of School Commissioners.

The Board of School Commissioners met in Kentville on Tuesday, 17th inst. Twelve members of the Board were present, and appointed L. deV. Chipman, Esq., Chairman.

Upon the report of the Inspector of Schools, to whom was referred the petition of John Eagles and Allen Benjamin, presented at last meeting, these men were transferred from Black River to White Rock Section.

On account of non-compliance with the Regulation requiring—(a) notices to be posted in the sections affected five days previous to the meeting of the Board stating the change sought, (b) plans of the sections to be furnished giving distances, &c., &c., (c) the amount of assessable property to be furnished—the petitions were referred back with instructions how to proceed.

From the School Land Fund of Cornwallis twenty dollars were voted to Garland in consideration of its excellent work in fitting up its School-house; and twenty dollars more were voted to Scott's Bay Road for repairs, on condition that this section expend thirty dollars in addition for the same purpose; and a further sum of fifteen dollars was voted to E. Pereaux Mountain, coupled with the condition that they expend twenty dollars of their own in completing the school-house.

Voted that the balance of this School Land Fund be drawn and placed in the bank, at interest, in the name of the Inspector of Schools. L. deV. Chipman, Wm. Eaton and W. E. Roscoe, Esq., were re-appointed a committee under Section 12, School Act, for the appointment of trustees, &c., &c.

A petition was presented from a number of rate-payers near Aldershot, asking for the formation of a new Section there, as this would affect several Sections in this vicinity and as a revision or a readjustment of the bounds of several Sections near here is contemplated in the near future, the petition was deferred one year.
