FACULTY OF LAW FOR ALBERTA UNIVERSITY

The Representatives of the Senate, the Judges of the Supreme Court and the Law Societies Meet in Calgary to Discuss the Question.

Calgary, Dec. 16.—An important conference between representatives of the Provincial University Senate, the Supreme Court judges and the Alberta Law Societies was held last night at the Court House, the object being to discuss the question of the establishment of a faculty of law in the university.

Premier Rutherford, Dr. Tory (president of the University), and P. J. Nolan, represented the University; Mr. Justice Beetz, Mr. Justice Stuart, the Supreme Court judges, and Messrs. Biggar (Edmonton), George W. Green (Red Deer) and James Main, of Calgary, the Alberta Law Societies.

The conference was an informal one and only a general outline of the plan was discussed. The representatives of the different interests affected will report to the bodies which they represent and a further conference will be held later. It is hoped that by the end of next year the matter will be far enough advanced for the establishment of the proposed law faculty in the promotion of which all the bodies named will co-operate.

Students at law will thus be enabled to take their lectures without going outside the province. The inauguration of University law degrees is a matter which rests entirely with the University senate.
