### FIGHTING IN ITALY.

ROME, To-day. (Official.) The artillery, at times, were lively in the Lagarine Valley and Valars, where an attempted enemy attack on Monte Como was repulsed. Four hostile planes were brought down and two were brought to earth while raiding Treviso.

### SUPERIOR TO ENEMY.

PARIS, To-day. (Official.) Eastern Theatre. — On the west bank of the Corvo, a Serbian assault detachment penetrated enemy trenches inflicting heavy losses. In Albania our operations terminated in the occupation of the whole mountain region dominating the right side of the Devoll, above the confluence of the Holitax River. On the left we occupied the villages of Iguba and Kokesheve and repulsed several counter attacks. The number of prisoners taken by our troops on July 21st and 22nd has reached 642, including 6 officers. On the other hand our losses have been insignificant. Our operations which have been completely successful in Albania for two months were conducted with effectiveness very inferior to those of the enemy. Our attacks have succeeded by reason of perfect preparation, and the bravery of our troops, who in the course of engagements, carried out sometimes in snow storms, and sometimes under an unbearable sun in a very difficult country, have by their skill and resolution taken indisputable ascendancy over their adversary.

### WAR REVIEW.

LONDON, To-day. (By the A. P.)—Violent counter attacks and rearguard actions in great strength still fail to serve the German high command as barriers to the Allied troops on the Somme slowly but surely they have failed somewhat in slowing down the fast pace set by the Allies at the commencement of the offensive, but nevertheless on the three sides of the new U-shaped front, further important gains have been made. Driving slowly but surely south of Soissons, the French and American troops have pushed their fronts further east toward that part of the Soissons-Chateau Thierry Railway line, that is still in the hands of the enemy, and further south along both sides of the Ourcq River, and the road leading to Fere en Tardenois, Germany's great storehouse for the supply of her troops to the south, important penetrations into enemy held ground have been made until the maximum points where the Allies are fighting, near Coligny, is about 10½ miles from their point of departure last Thursday. In the Marne region, north of Chateau-Thierry, the French and Americans have met with the fiercest kind of resistance, for here the enemy machine gunners and infantrymen are trying hard to stay their progress, with an endeavour to extricate a large number of German forces which are in danger of capture, and save part of the enormous numbers of guns and material, which it is impossible to get out except by the high roads over the undulating and wooded country.

The advantage in the fighting, however, has been with amalgamated Allied forces, who have pushed on north, passed the village of Episod, and ousted the Germans from the greater part of the Chatelot Forest. In this region the Allies now hold the villages of Episod and Trugney-Episod, which were captured by the enemy and were recaptured on Wednesday in a counter attack by the Americans. Pressing on north the Allies have driven their front beyond Courpail, which lies about 6½ miles northeast of Chateau Thierry and along the Marne at many points, notably in the region of Chartres and Jaulgonne, and further east at Treloup, the Allies have put the north bank of the Marne further behind them in advances and captured a large number of cannon and machine guns and considerable war material. In the region between the Marne and Rheims, where the German Crown Prince has brought forward large numbers of picked reinforcements to stay the British and Italians, his warriors are meeting hard usage. Following up the advances of the French and Italians of Tuesday, the British immediately to the southwest of Rheims, apparently have begun a movement which possibly portends good results. Here the British have overcome a strong counter attack and a violent bombardment, and struck the enemy line at Vregny for a goodly gain. This manoeuvre if pressed to further advantage will seriously menace the Rheims-Flamant Railway, a scant three miles to the north, and also will tend materially to lessen the girth of the mouth of the pocket through which the Germans are endeavouring to retreat from the Soissons-Rheims salient. Guaged by war maps the new inroads of the Allied troops into the German held territory necessarily add further to the extreme gravity of the situation of the Germans inside the huge pocket, and with the long range guns at both sides

of the U heavily bombarding them far behind the actual fighting fronts, with airmen bombing them assiduously, and the infantry attacking them on all sides with rifles and light gun fire, their position seemingly is a hazardous one.

### A SCHOOL OF SHARKS.

LONDON, To-day. From three to eight submarines are said to have been concerned in the attack on the Justicia, according to the Daily Mail, which says the fight began at 3 p.m. Friday and lasted intermittently until Saturday morning. The ship sank about 1 p.m. after nine torpedoes had been fired. When the liner was first struck, the torpedo boat destroyers which accompanied her rushed to attack the enemy and dropped many depth charges, while patrol boats stood by the ship and a tug took her in tow. The second and third torpedoes were fired about 5 p.m., and both missed their mark, one going ahead of the steamer and the other ast. Two hours later another torpedo was seen coming, but when it got near, a gunner on the liner, with extraordinary aim hit it and it exploded. All was quiet until 8 p.m. when another torpedo was sighted. The gunners on the Justicia placed their shots so near it that the torpedo was deflected and missed its target. Most of the crew by this time had been transferred to other ships which had remained near the ship all night. The Justicia was well on her way to port Saturday morning when near 8 o'clock the gunners again were hard at work as the sixth and seventh torpedoes went past. Two hours later a submarine fired the eighth and ninth torpedoes. One of them struck forward and the other ast.

### GERMANS THROW IN MORE RESERVES.

PARIS, To-day. More reserves are being thrown into the battle by the Germans, according to the latest advice reaching Paris, but these were unable to prevent the Allies from making appreciable gains Wednesday. The important point of Oulchy-le-Chateau slowly but surely is being surrounded. If the Germans lose it, it will be impossible for them to hang on to Fere-en-Tardenois. Military observers here are convinced that General Ludendorff will shortly launch a counter-offensive. His objects will be, first to clean the front between Soissons and Rheims; second to lessen the demoralising effect of a projected retreat to the Vesle, and third to have Germany gain the initiative. Consequently it is to his interest to prolong the present battle as long as possible, even at the expense of his treasured reserves so as to keep the French occupied and give him time to prepare another blow.

### NINE DIVISIONS RUSHED TO AID CROWN PRINCE.

LONDON, To-day. Nine divisions of reserves from the army of Crown Prince Rupprecht, of Bavaria, and a division from the eastern end of the line, have been rushed to the aid of the Crown Prince William, between Soissons and Rheims, but, says Reuter's correspondent with American troops in France, the Germans may well hesitate to push more troops into the already crowded salient, seeing the difficulty they have of feeding those already there. German resistance on the southern sectors of the salient has been reduced to a mere shell, it is added, and the enemy doubtlessly is concentrating his efforts on keeping open the northern outlets of the salient. The Allied drive toward Oulchy-le-Chateau, not only threatens the enemy communications with Fere-en-Tardenois, but it is a serious threat for the German troops around Episod, whose line of retreat will pass through the fire.

### IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS ISSUED.

DUBLIN, To-day. (By the A. P.)—The press censor issued for publication in to-day's papers, important documents, containing the original details of the reports of the Irish Volunteer leaders in Cork, Kerry and Limerick, explaining to the Irish volunteer executive their actions during the rebellions. The reports are dated September, 1917, and show "the utter futility of the rising and the treachery and selfishness of the Germans toward their unfortunate dupes." The documents were seized by the police during a search, in May last, of the officials of the association for affording aid to rebellion sufferers. They narrate the confusion of plans following on the failure to land an army, and Sir Roger Casement's, Col. Vist, of the Limerick volunteers, concluding his report says, "On Monday morning Lieut. Whelan returned from his second trip to Tralee, having seen Montith (Captain Robert Montith of the German Army who was landed in Ireland from a German submarine) and brought word from him that no men were coming, that the arms sent to us were gone, that the Germans were out for cheap Irish blood and
