### TO-DAY'S MESSAGES.

**TOLL OF THE FIRE FIEND.**  
NEW YORK, March 31.  
Two firemen were killed and sixteen injured to-day, fighting a spectacular fire that swept two factories and four tenements on the East Side, and for a time threatened Bellevue Hospital, with two thousand patients. The dead and injured were buried beneath a brick wall, toppled into the street by a gas explosion.

**HALF MILLION PEOPLE INVOLVED**  
ESSEN, March 31.  
A proclamation by General Degoutte, ordering all striking railroad officials and trainmen to resume work under penalty of expulsion, was posted throughout the Ruhr and Rhineland to-day. Approximately 125,000 men came under the order, and, with their families, number five hundred thousand.

**FRENCH SEIZE CURRENCY.**  
HOECHST, Prussia, March 31.  
Ten billion marks and four hundred thousand French francs, shipped by the Frankfurt Branch of the Reichsbank to the Westphalian branch, were seized this afternoon by the French.

**SELF CONFESSED CRIMINAL.**  
LOS ANGELES, March 31.  
Herbert Wilson, former Evangelist, alleged mail robber and murderer, has told postal inspectors that he can solve the bombing of J. Pierpont Morgan's offices in Wall Street, New York, in September 1920. The explosive, which filled the bomb, which killed thirty-nine persons and destroyed property valued at many thousands of dollars, was manufactured by Wilson, according to his own admissions, and was sold by him to the man, who has been charged with guilty knowledge of the crime.

### An Easter Message.

O death, where is thy victory? The message of Easter is that Life is lord of Death. It perpetuates the memory of a great fact in the history of our Lord, a fact which alone is able to explain the Christian religion. No attempts made to explain away the resurrection of Jesus have been successful. What else could have dispelled the gloom and hopelessness of the disciples after the death of Jesus? What else can explain the perennial power of the gospel to keep alive the church, and make the Christian religion the one vital and progressive spiritual force in the world? If Jesus, at his crucifixion, had simply dropped back into the silence of eternity, the Christian religion would have died at its birth; but Jesus did reappear, not once but many times and to many persons, and gave ample assurance that he was alive, and what was of far greater importance, that he was still interested in his disciples and in their work, and that he would continue to be with them forever. It was this assurance, this blessed confidence that turned their night of despair into morning light, and gave them boldness and courage to proclaim their message.

And now, what is the message of Easter for our day? What does it mean for the men who are seeking to do God's will in the service of their fellow men to-day, for the men who in pursuance of their high task are misunderstood, deemed smitten of God, despised and rejected of men? It is for them the message of hope and victory. It inspires them with courage to face the great task of redeeming the world. In the hardness and loneliness of their toil, they are encouraged by the assurance that he ever liveth, "Lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world." In discouragement and apparent defeat, they are comforted by the thought that though they may follow the Master in the rough and cruel road to calvary, they too shall see of the travail of their soul and be satisfied, "Because he liveth, we shall live also."

### Watchful at Fermeuse.

COULD NOT GET AROUND CAPE.

S.S. Watchful, which ship left here for the Westward at 5 a.m. yesterday, failed to get around Cape Race and had to put back owing to ice conditions. The Government Coastal Department received a message from Capt. Stephen Parsons of the Watchful this morning, via Admiralty Cove, Fermeuse, stating as follows:—"Reached Cape Race 4 p.m. yesterday. Ice packed on land. Impossible to get through and returned to Fermeuse for the night. Left again at daylight. Wind South East, strong; ice still packed on land; awaiting change of wind."

### Kyle at Louisburg.

**TWO WEEKS PASSAGE.**  
The Reid Nid, Co. were to-day apprised by wire that S.S. Kyle had arrived Louisburg at 8 o'clock this morning. The Kyle met with abnormal ice conditions since leaving port some two weeks ago, and her arrival in Louisburg ends a very tedious voyage. As soon as the ship replenishes bunkers and loads whatever freight is offering there, she will come direct to St. John's.

**SAPPER SAILING.**—Mr. J. W. N. Johnstone received a message yesterday stating that S. S. Canadian Sapper would sail from Halifax for this port on April 4th.

**ICE BOUND.**—There is no reported change in the Glencoe's and Argylla's positions. The former is held at Argentia and the latter at Berin.
