The Royalists lost over 600 men in the fight at Santander, but succeeded in regaining possession of the city. General Colonge marches to morrow on Santona, and has resolved to burn every place if they make any resistance.

Paris, Sept. 28.—Count Walewaki died yesterday, aged 59 years.

Paris, Sept. 28.—The Moniteur, has the following news from Spain:—Alcoy, a city of about 30,000 people, in the Province of Alicante, has revolted. Three ships appeared off Cartagean. It is sufficiently in still recruiting. It is said that the town of keen has prenounced for therevaluationists, also Saragossa; and that Gen. Jean Penuela, Count of Cheste was killed.

London, Sept. 28.—Advices from Spain to day confirm all the previous reports that the insurgents are masching in force upon the capital of the nation. The royal troops who were sent against Santander, and since the capture of that city have been engaged in pursuing the rebels in that quarter, have received orders to return so, Madrid for the purpose of projecting the capital. The revolution is rapidly progressing in the interior. The city, of Vallaced has pronounced against the Queen, and the revolt has early extended to most of the provinces into which Old and New Castile are divided.


