"The Presbyterian Synod Declines to Define Location"

"STRATHCONA NOT PERMANENT SITE"

"There was considerable discussion upon the question this morning. The present political conditions were referred to and it was urged and tacitly admitted that despite the fact that a site had been purchased in Strathcona for the university, that there was no definite location yet, and that the ultimate location was not yet settled.

It was decided unanimously that a motion be presented to the assembly urging that a Theological College be established in Alberta, but no reference or recommendation was made regarding the location of such an institution. Affiliation with the Provincial University was favored, but in the motion which had been presented reading "The Provincial University at Strathcona" the words "at Strathcona" were struck out.

In other words, it was decided to recommend the establishment of a Theological College in connection with the Provincial University, but to make no declaration as to the location of the Provincial University."

FIGURES SHOW GROWTH OF EMPIRE

British Subjects Now Estimated to Exceed in Number 388 Million.

London, April 28.—An official volume crowded with interesting figures, entitled "Statistical Abstract for the British Empire in each year, from 1884 to 1908," has been issued. The book deals with area, population and trade.

The following table indicates the growth of the population:

The total population of the empire, which in 1881 was 388,694,000, had increased in 1908 to 385,357,000, while the area reached 11,294,000 square miles, giving an average population of thirty-four to the square mile.

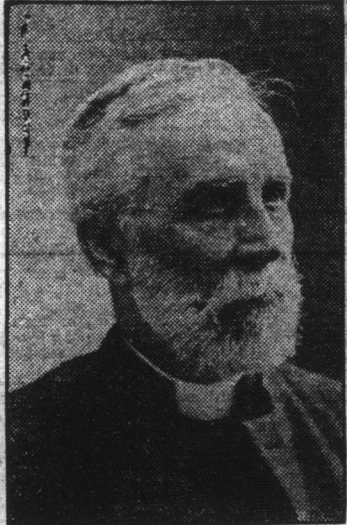

GUARANTEE WAS NOT SUFFICIENT

Government Will Probably Not Build Packing Plant Immediately

Strathcona, April 28.—According to Mr. Stevens, the Provincial Life Stock Commissioner, who was in the city almost the entire day yesterday, the proposed pork packing plant to be established by the government upon a sufficient supply of hogs marketed by the farmers of Alberta, is now inevitably doomed to be held over for another year. This unpleasant termination of the movement recently promoted actively by the executive of the U. F. A. and members of the department of agriculture has resulted from the diversity of circumstances according to Mr. Stevens, who expresses genuine regret that some definite establishment project could not be put into action this year.

In the first place Mr. Stevens says the canvass for signatures to the guarantee amongst the farmers did not meet with the success that ought to be expected, but he feels confident that when the matter is gone into more thoroughly with the organized branches of the association there will be found signers in plenty, but this cannot now be before next season.

Then again the difficulty that beset the government at the opening of the legislature caused a feeling of uneasiness amongst certain sections of farming districts, and many that doubtless would have signed the provisional agreement decided to hold off for a while and see what might be seen. Furthermore, Mr. Stevens is of the opinion that the crisis in the legislature would now preclude any strong possibility of the question being taken up and disposed of satisfactorily in time for operations on a large scale to be started this summer. There seems no other course ahead but to wait and perfect if possible the plans for pushing the proposition to a definite settlement in 1911. There might in the meantime, advised the commissioner, be a great deal of attention given the subject by farmers and others concerned, which would perhaps effect a considerable improvement in the plans as outlined now, thus paying well for the delay.

PARI-MUTUELS NOT ALLOWED AFTER ALL

Information Received by Vancouver Horsemen Incorrect According to Author.

Ottawa, April 28.—That Mr. Geo. E. Powell, who claimed to represent the British Columbia horsemen before the Anti-Gambling Committee, made a slight mistake when he wired Vancouver that the new Miller racing bill legalized betting by the Pari-Mutuel system without any time limit, was made very clear by Mr. H. H. Miller, when seen here.
"Oh, no," laughed Mr. Miller. "They tried to get me to consent to legalize the Pari-Mutuel device specifically, even just during the fourteen days allowed. They were afraid it would not be lawful even under the time limit. But I refused. I told them we would allow the Pari-Mutuel system just as another form of betting on the track, but only for the fourteen days in the year.
