### FIVE DOLLARS A YEAR FOR RENT

You Can Get Two Rooms in Vienna for That Amount Per Annum.

Vienna, Dec. 26.—The Government axes rents in this country, stipulating in some cases the amounts that ought to be charged, too. Hence landlords have to be good, to a certain extent, and tenants must not kick lest they offend the august Imperial Government and go to jail. Throughout Austria all living quarters must consist of a kitchen and a living room and, according to the lists just published, Vienna has 2 homes of this character for which no more than five New York, Dec. 26 .- The New York dollars annual rent is charged. In other Austrian cities this low figure is even less a curiosity. Lemberg has 279 and Laiboh 145 homes renting at five ollars per year.

Nearly seven hundred Vienna flats, having from two to four rooms, rent for from five to ten dollars annually. Nearly 5,000 flats rent from ten to authorized in the naval program of twenty dollars annually, while nearly 24,000 rent for from twenty to forty

dollars per annum. The tax commission found one fiat, consisting of a kitchen and fifteen rooms renting for four hundred dollars per year. Another flat of the same price consisted of twenty rooms.
