

OTTAWA, Aug. 22.—(Canadian Press.)—It was understood here this evening that further representations made to Right Hon. Arthur Meighen by leading members and supporters of the Government today were strongly against the staging of a general election this fall. Supporters of the Government urged, it was said, that the election should not be held until spring at the very earliest.

There was no other indication of just what decision the premier would reach, and it was thought probable that the final pronouncement would not be made for some days.

It is expected that the writ for the by-election in West York, Ontario, will be issued either tomorrow or Wednesday owing to the expiration of the time limit of six months since the seat was declared vacant.
