### DISAGREE ON ROUTE TO ENTER THRACE

Occupation Via Constantinople.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Oct. 24.-Turkish gendarmerie in their occupation of Eastern Thrace. Rafet Pasha, the new military governor of Thrace, at a lengthy conference with the allied chiefs yesterday, urged that the gendarmes be permitted to go through Constantinople, but was told that the bulk of these forces must enter Thrace by way of Rodosto. None of the conferees seemed in a friendly mood. Rafet Pasha is being entertained by the allied high commissioners during his stay here. He plans to leave for Thrace on Saturday. With Shakir Bey, the new civil governor of Thrace, he is considering numerous application for employment from Turks desiring to participate in the government of the province.
