KILLED MAN WHO RUINED HIS WIFE.

Made Him Signs Confession of His Guilt Then Shot Him.

FORT WORTH, Texas, Mar. 15.—Fred Morris, a baseball player, last night shot and instantly killed Otto H. Meyer, a vaudeville singer, in a room in a local hotel, after having obtained a written confession that his relations with Mrs. Morris were improper.

The two men came to the hotel together and were assigned to the same room. Shortly after they had retired the shots were heard. Meyer was found lying in a pool of blood, while Morris, upon the approach of the hotel authorities, calmly announced, "I guess I am the man you are looking for. I think the police need me."

After he and Meyer had reached the room, Morris declared he read an interesting letter, the significance of which Meyer admitted. He then forced Meyer to write and sign the confession and then told him he intended to kill him.

Meyer "told me his arms," said Morris, "and told me to shoot him through the heart, so that all would be over at once. I did as he suggested and would follow him beyond the grave except for the fact that I have a little boy, who, I think, needs me to look after him."

TRIED TO ESCAPE FROM N. B. REFORMATORY

UNIFORM CLOSE SEASON FOR LOBSTERS

Prof. Prince Recommends from July 1 to January 1 for the Whole of the Maritime Provinces

OTTAWA, Mar. 15.—At a meeting of the fisheries committee of the commonwealth Thursday Prof. Prince urged that a close season for lobsters along the whole coast of the maritime provinces should be made from July 1 to January 1, or falling date, that the closed season as specified, should be applied to the coast west and south of Cape Canby and for the remainder of the coast north of Cape Canby the closed season to be from July 15 to January 1.

A uniform closed season was needed for the spawning months. At present the chief offenders against the regulation for the protection of berried lobsters were the canner who upped temporarily profit before conservation of the lobster resources.

Prof. Prince thought that the claims of Canadian canners should have priority consideration to those of the American canners. "This was endorsed by Dr. Daniel and A. E. MacLean the latter recommending imprisonment in addition."

MYSTERY STILL IN KINRAE MURDER AT HAMILTON, ONT.

DETECTIVE SHADOWS FLORENCE KINRAE ON EVERY MONE-TO PROTECT HER HE STATES. EXAMINATION STILL ON.

HAMILTON, Ont., Mar. 14.—Another witness has turned up in the Kinrae murder case, C. S. Wilcox, who lives five doors east of the family residence, who says that between 1:10 and 1:30 on the afternoon of the murder he heard three shots fired. He took them for far away blasts, but after the murder became known he concluded they were the shots that had killed the girl.

Wilcox is now in Jamaica, but the statement is in possession of the crown authorities. Crown Attorney Wasington has not decided to use the statement yet.

Another statement is made that Miss Florence Kinrae is under police surveillance, but the crown attorney denied this after the inquest on Friday. He says a detective is protecting her more than watching. Detective Black says the man on the job must go wherever she goes.

Doctors and detectives have now agreed that nine shots were fired by the assassin. Formerly the number was placed at seven. This is regarded as supporting Florence's statement as the murderer probably had two revolvers.

Crown Attorney Wasington was asked if Miss Florence Kinrae would be called to the witness stand. He replied that she would be called to the witness stand if she were not otherwise occupied.


