of Warsaw.

"Attempts of the Germans to reconstruct the railroads east of Lowicz and Skierniewice have failed," it is stated. "Cossacks operating in force in this territory have dedstroyed the tracks as fast as they have been relaid. "That the German plan of campaign in Poland is similar to that followed in France is indicated by reports that, all along their main line west of the Vistula, the Austra-German forces are throwing up strong entrenchments.

"These trenches extend across the Visula into Galicia. They are of elaborate construction, apparently being designed for the protection of the troops during a long campaign."
