A FORGER CONFESSES.

CHIGAGO, April 16.—Charles F. Renne, the defaulting cashier of the brokerage firm of H. H. Carr & Co., was arraigned in the Armory Police Court to day on a charge of forgery. Although it was reported that his deficiency would not exceed \$500, drawn from the Bank would not acceed \$600, dra wn from the Bank of Montreal, an all night's inspection of his books by an expert accommant shows that his embezzlements reach into the thousands. In fact H. H. Carr & Co. are greatly excited over the magnitude of the bookkeeper's stealings, as they had no idea that they had been robbed of more than \$500. The investigations last night show that on Jan 24, 1887, a forgery of \$500 was committed, also on Feb. 14, one of more than \$500. March 19, \$500, and April 2, \$500. Three checks of \$100 each were also forged prior to the above dates. The accountant states, that during 1885 and 1886 several large forgeries were also made, but cannot ascertain the exact amount. 
