Transmission by belts is a relic of routine which should be rooted out, as has been already done with the ancient gear-wheel transmission.

Why? We cannot explain, but when the next Exposition opens we will see if they continue to inflict upon their patrons a mode of transmission which, whatever be the ingenuity of the makers of belts, leather, cotton or steel, will always absorb more power and cause more stoppages than transmission by ropes.
