NOTE AND COMMENT.

A new code of regulations has been arranged at Washington designed to facilitate touring across the Canadian border. By these regulations touring cars will be entered free while racing machines, bicycles, airships, and racing shells, brought in for racing or similar contests, may remain 6 months under free admission privileges.

According to the last bulletin of the Ontario Bureau of Industry, in the reports on farm labor, a variety of things is happening, some of them decidedly serious. Here are a few samples:—Farmers exchanging work; everybody roots for himself; do what they can and let the rest go; using more machinery; land lying idle; land being laid down to grass; children helping in farm work; only half the tillable land sown; where two hands should be employed there are none; land not being half worked; using wider implements.

The Summer Rain Fall.

According to the figures compiled by the local observatory in South London, the rainfall during the past three months, July, August and September, has been phenomenal. The figures this year are nearly double those of last year. During the three months of 1912 the total rainfall was 15.13 inches, compared to 8.04 inches for the same months last year. More rain fell in August of this year than July and August together, last year. Also, more rain fell in any of the three months this year than in the months of July and September of a year ago.
