COLPORTAGE IN ONTARIO AND THE NORTH-WEST.

N the very first number that was issued of the Canada Christian Monthly, in 1873, the reader will see an article on "Colportage in Canada." In that article occurs the following sentences:

"The Religious Book and Tract Society" of Toronto has done good in the past, and is now in a prosperous condition; but its work is only half done till it establishes a system of Colportage that shall embrace every township in the Province of Ontario. Scotia, a system of Colportage is now in operation; and in the Province of Quebec, such a work has been carried on for years, and with such blessed effects, among the Roman Catholics, as eternity alone can fully disclose. Scotland is occupied by Colporteurs from the Solway Frith to John O'Groat's: the system is spreading in England, over the northern counties, and slowly stretching towards the centre and south.... With the danger to which our young are exposed, by unwholesome literature, staring us in the face; with the example of other countries inviting us to proceed; it surely cannot be that the Province of Ontario must admit, by its doing nothing, that it lacks heads to devise a system of Colportage, and hearts to carry it on."

It will soon be six years since these words were penned. Whether they had anything to do with the event we are now glad
