

DR. THOMAS FILLEBROWN.

Canadian dentists in Ontario and Quebec who, at the opening of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons, October, 1896, had the pleasure of meeting and knowing Dr. Thomas Fillebrown, of Boston, President of the new National Dental Association, will be glad to see his portrait again. Was educated at Maine Wesleyan Seminary. Graduated at the Medical School of Maine and the Dental School of Harvard University. For several years he was lecturer on dental subjects at the Portland School of Medical Instruction. In 1883 he was appointed Professor of Operative and Oral Surgery. He commenced the practice of dentistry in Lewiston, Maine, in 1861; removed to Portland in 1875, and since 1883 has practised
