"The Kreutzer Sonata."

Strange, ead, nay oven weird are the dreams of Count Tolstoi. In the many short sketches from his pen, which from time to time have been published, we are prepared for anything, oven if it is savored of the somnamia or lethargic melancholy so strongly characteristic of latter day Slavio novelists. Poor Tolstoi I Man of genius as thou art: born for better things, yet destined to dwell in the very pandemonium of human sorrow, on the banks of the Dniester and m the land of the Tyrant of the Russias. He, the here of this strange book, tells the story of his miserable life. Woman, poor and wretched, falls under this individual's lash, and it is not surprising that scarcely a kind word is said of her. In the North American Review, a short time ago, appeared a very clever review of this book by Robt. G. Ingersoll, one with whom we do not agree on matters orthodox, but in this we accept his edict. In his criticism he most rightcously and vigorously attacks the author. Ingersoli seems as one who enters the arena with Tolstoi, tights for the honor of women, and quits the Forum a conquoring hero. We are glad of this, for many little critics, who raised their creed objections in diff-cent forms, seemal to us weak and pucrite. Not so with Ingersoll. Manly from the start, he fights with somewhat of a defiaut spirit, and he who has read this criticism must yield to him the palm. Enough for the review. The book "Kreutzer Sonata" is upon the book shelves everywhere, destined to what period of book life we know not. That it will replonish the author's pocket as well as the publisher's, there can be no doubt; but as to that which is of greater moment to every honest author, and such we believo Count Tolstoi, a new system of ethics, which he is desirous of inaugurating, a system he will live in vain to see accomplished, for however true his picture of married life in Russia may be, it in no sense illustrates our Auglo Saxon homes.
