The foregoing is a statement of the moneys received during the past eight months for the "Jubilee Endowment Fund." During that time, Mr. Hague has completed the payment of his promised \$5,000, and the churches of the Dominion lie under a deep debt of gratitude to him for his stimulating offer, which began the

Jubilee Endowment. It is earnestly hoped that the stimulus will be sufficiently strong and lasting to carry out the original design of bringing up the total endowment to \$50,000. Nothing short of that should satisfy us at present.

On the original subscriptions secured in 1888, there is a balance of almost \$1,000 still unpaid. This amount ought all to be paid in this year; but the Treasurer regrets that in two or three cases, applications made by him, by letter repeatedly, have failed to elicit a replynot even a request for delay. This is not as it should be. A written promise to pay a given amount to a college, should be as promptly met as if it were given for any other debt.
