CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

From the standpoint of volume of busi ness, the first week of May has not in we than held its own. Enquires for la aber have not been lacking, but the shortage in the supply of dry stock makes a almost impossible to fill large orders. The will men are as firm as ever, and if one can judge by their attitude when approached by a buyer, prices are not likely to be marked down in the near future. It may be said that conditions favor the maintenance of present prices. American buyers are still in the market for pine lumber. A Georgian Bay manufacturer is reported as saying that within one month:he has sold \$350,000 worth of lumber for shipment to the United States. Notwithstanding the benefit of late rains, a considerable quantity of legs are yet in danger of being hung up. Even if a full stock of logs is secured, the quantity of lumber that can be offered by manufacturers will, on account of the heavy sales already made, be comparatively small, while if there should be an appreciable shortage in the log supply, conditions favoring still higher prices would be encountered. While these remarks apply to pine, they are equally applicable to hardwoods, the difference being that the shortage in the production of hardwood logs is a certainty, very light stocks having been taken out last winter. Holders of hardwood lumber are demanding full prices and find little difficulty an effecting a sale whenever the lumber is wanted. A strong market for hardwood lumber this season is confidently looked for.

The retail demand in Toronto has been

quiet on account of labor troubles. A great deal of building has been held back awaiting a settlement with the different trades, and as soon as this is assured there is likely to be more than usual activity for two or three months.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

The first cargoes of lumber for the season left the St. Lawrence within the past week. The charters effected would not eate that the season will not be particularized active, but it is likely that the total shipments will not be materially less than last year. No doubt more lumber will be marketed in the United States, and this increase is likely to be made at the ex-pense of British trade. Millmen in Quebec report numerous enquiries from the Lastern States for clapboards and other spruce lumber for immediate shipment, but it frequently happens that dry stock is not
