This is the Wholesale and Retail Agency for the largest Furniture Manufacturer in the great walnut growing countries of the United States, from which the Furniture is sent in the rough, and fitted up, finished and upholstered in the finest style on the premises, thus enabling the purchaser to procure the best material and workmanship of the American manufacturers at the least possible cost. A fair portion of the furniture of the Windsor Hotel, and all the furniture of the new Ottawa Hotel, was purchased at this Establishment. Shipments are made daily to towns in the Province of Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, and Prince Edward Island.

DESCRIPTION OF THE BUILDING (728).—The basement floor of the main building contains Common Chairs and Tables, Kitchen Furniture, Mattresses, Gasaliers, Crockery, Oilcloth, Carpets (new and second hand), and Cheap Mirrors and Pictures.
