His life in Parliament, his correspondence with Sir Robert Peel, and later with Mr. Bright and other public men, together with his own intimate knowledge of all that was of most importance in English history during a half century which saw the Crimean War, the Indian Mutiny and the American Civil War, furnish rich material for a biography which must be interesting, even in less capable hands than the author's. In Mr. Morley's hands the book will be of unusual importance as well as of supreme interest. of supreme interest.
