Again, recent surveys show that quite clearly: that, in the economic field, they tend to believe that the Federal government has more power and more leverage than the Provincial government. And what is interesting in the current situation: We had, again, a recent survey, and asked the people who they blamed for the current economic situation. Strangely enough -- or, I don't know; I should not say "strangely enough" -it came out that way: that about 45% blamed the Provincial Government: 15% the business community; 13% the Labor movement; and 11% the Federal Government.

So, to come back to one of the previous questions as to the implication of who bears the blame for the economic situation, it appears to be different from the one you would expect in a different context.
