PRAYERS.

The following Petitions were severally brought up, and laid on the Table:—

By Mr. Boyce—The Petition of The Pacific and Atlantic Railway Company (incorporated by an Act of the Legislature of the Province of Ontario, chapter 76, passed in the 49th year of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria.)

By Mr. Beattie—The Petition of William Alexander Hunt Jenkins, of the City of London, County of Middlesex, Province of Ontario, Manufacturer, the lawful husband of Isabella (Minnie Belle) Jenkins (née Karns), of the City of Hamilton, County of Wentworth, Ontario.

By Mr. Clements—The Petition of The Kootenay Central Railway Company.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the following Petitions were read and received:—

Of Jesse Wilbert Hearn, of the Township of Sidney, County of Hastings, formerly of East Toronto, Province of Ontario, the lawful husband of Helen Hearn (née Creller), of the City of Saginaw, State of Michigan, one of the United States of America; praying for the passing of an Act to declare his marriage with the said Helen Hearn, his wife, to be dissolved, and that he be divorced from her.

Of the Cap de la Madeleine Railway Company; praying for the passing of an Act declaring its undertaking to be a work for the general advantage of Canada, authorizing the Company to lease their Railway to the Canadian Pacific Railway Company, and for other purposes.

Of the Dominion Atlantic Railway Company; praying for the passing of an Act to extend the time for the commencement and completion of their Railway, and to increase their bonding powers.

Of the Canadian Pacific Railway Company; praying for the passing of an Act to extend the time for the construction of their authorized lines of Railways, in Western Canada, and for other purposes.

Of Charles Willoughby and others, of the City of Regina, Province of Saskatchewan; praying for an Act of Incorporation under the name of the Saskatchewan Life Insurance Company.

Of John Hunter and others, Depositors in the Farmers' Bank of Canada; praying that adequate measures may be taken by Parliament so that relief may be afforded them.

Of Jacob J. Meyer and others, Depositors in the Farmers' Bank of Canada; praying that a Royal Commission should forthwith issue to enquire into and investigate the incorporation and organization of the said bank, and for other purposes.
