**Question No. 28—Mr. Broadbent:**

**MOVEMENT OF DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES**

**Question No. 46—Mr. Lewis:**

1. Which federal government department is responsible for the safety control of transferring or moving dangerous materials, poisons and poisonous gases within Canada?
2. Which federal government department is responsible for the control of dangerous materials, poisons and poisonous gases moving across Canada's border?
3. What specific standards have been established for such shipments within and across Canada's borders?
4. Did officials stop the shipment of phosgene gas from the United States to Canada during the

first week in August, 1969 and if so, for what reason?

5. At that time, were all shipments of poisons, poisonous gases and other dangerous materials being stopped from entry into Canada?

6. Are officials of the Department of National Revenue presently prohibiting all shipments of poison gas from the United States to Canada and, if not, for what reason?

**OIL LAND EXPLORATION PERMITS**

**Question No. 95—Mr. Thomson (Battleford-Kindersley):**

1. What permits for oil land exploration in Canada's Yukon and Northwest Territories have been issued by the federal government?
2. For the above permits, what are (a) the names and addresses of individuals or corporations holding such permits (b) the names of the members of each consortium holding a permit, with the percentage interest held by each member of the consortium respectively (c) the total acreage covered by the permit or permits held by each individual or corporation and by each consortium respectively, and (d) the percentage owned or controlled by non-residents of Canada for each individual corporation or consortium respectively?
