which Working Group had its terms of reference set out in February, 1968 and which was formed to examine and outline the problems relating to Indians and to make recommendations concerning strategy, policy and programming.

Mr. Yves Forest (Parliamentary Secretary to the President of the Privy Council): Mr. Speaker, on behalf of the Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development I wish to report as follows: The hon. member for Skeena requested this same information in his motion for the production of papers No. 82. The hon, member was informed then that the document he requested in the motion for the production of papers No. 82 could not be identified. On April 23 the hon. member for Winnipeg North Centre, on behalf of the hon. member for Skeena, agreed that this motion be withdrawn. As the motion for the production of papers No. 116 is identical to the motion for production of papers No. 82, and the document still cannot be identified, I would ask the hon, member to withdraw the motion.

Mr. Howard (Skeena): Mr. Speaker, I think perhaps the hon. member for Winnipeg North Centre was misled by the reply given on an earlier occasion. Perhaps I could assist the efficiency of the government by tabling the particular document in question now. This might help them find it.
