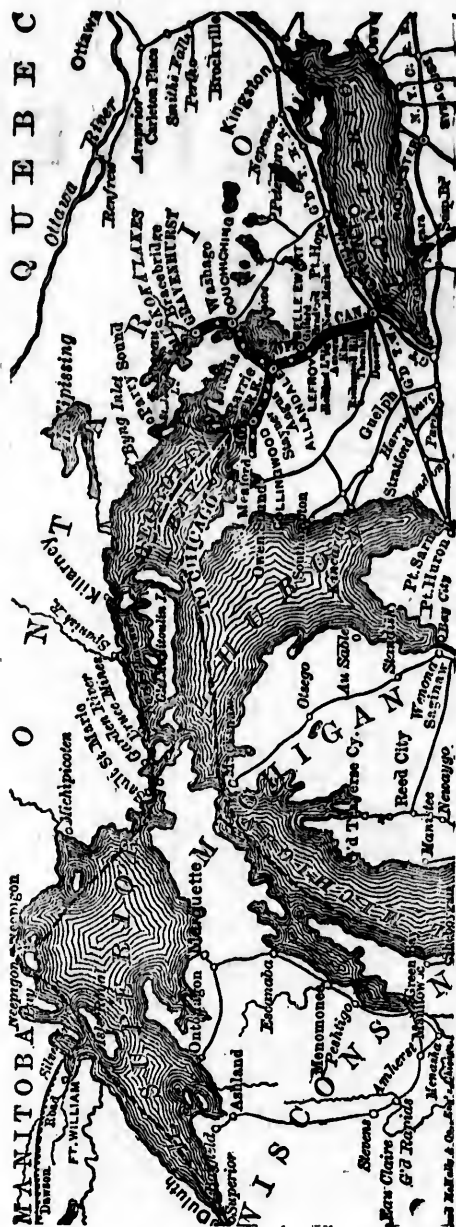




Via DULUTH
