them; and fuch Artifices may be used, and such Clamours raised, by ill designing People, that the present, or some future Administration, may find themselves under the Necessity of removing them, even against the Bent of their own Inclinations; or they, perhaps, may themselves voluntarily resign, finding their Salaries by no Means in Proportion to the Dignity of their Office, and the Affluence which they have been accustomed to from their Cradles; and we may be assured, that they would shudder at the Thoughts of making up the Deficiencies, by any clandestine or indirect Methods. Or, as I have already observed, Man's Life is every where precarious, but more so in that Hemisphere. The Damps and vehement Heats of Florida, must undoubtedly be extreamly prejudicial to Northern Constitutions; but in Canada, the human Frame has innumerable Foes to combat with, not only the sudden Viciflitudes
