Two days of negotiation between Chance and Frank Farrell, owner of the New York Club, were brought to a climax this afternoon when the printipals quietly visited the office of Ban Johnson, president of the league. There they came to their agreement after less than an hour's conference, and there the announcement was made.

"Gentlemen, let me introduce the new mamager of the New York Americans, said Mr. Farrell to the reporters, as he. Johnson and Manager Chance emerged from the conference.

Both Farrell and Manager Chance kept secret the actual details of their conferences. Chance candidly admitted that he had had a change of heart since he arrived in Chicago, and said he had been offered terms which no one in his right mind could refuse.

"I honestly did not expect to sign." he said tonight. "When I arrived yesterday I had fully made up my mind that my interests lay in the west, and that I could not afford to leave them at least for a year. Mr. Farrell, however, offered inducements much better than I had dreamed of, and, even excluding my love for the game as a factor. I could not declare them."

The terms, learn d from an authoritative course, the not officially announced, include for Chance a contract to manage the club for three years at \$2:000 a year and 5 per cent. of the club's net earnings for the three seasons. The latter, it is believed, will annount to \$15,000 annually, perhaps more.
