

## Champion Leafs Move Up In the International Race

### GOULAIT STINGS THE SKEETERS LEAFS MADE IT THREE STRAIGHT

Kelley's Band Went After  
Davis in Fourth and Counted  
Three Times — Shaw  
Supplies a Homer With a  
Man on Base—Leafs Were  
Always Best.

It was the "skirt day" of the season and the Kelley Klan went out and chanted another win just to see the fair fanettes smile. George Davis, the millionaire college flogger, was trotted out by Schaffly as another special treat for the ladies, and the Leafs broke the bank to the extent of 5 runs and led the Skeeters 5-0 in the fourth. It was the third straight win over the Schaffly colts, and six out of the first seven games played on the home grounds this season.
